
THE CIC REVIEW PROCESS — HOW WE COULD WORK TOGETHER

START

Residents are given a platform to talk openly and honestly with BRL regarding the CIC - why it is changing, what people want it to be and whether the framework process that has been identified is helpful.



Once consensus on a process has been agreed, a role descriptor for joining the Learning Forum, as well as for the Independent Chair, is circulated to those who have chosen to be involved. This is refined together with stakeholders, both via individual conversations and also through public engagement opportunities.



After this prolonged investigation period and once a draft CIC structure has been agreed, the CIC Learning Forum holds a series of public engagement meetings to publicise the final model they are recommending for the reconstitution.

The Independent Chair leads
the group through a series of
workshops, visits, training and
learning activities until the group
feels that they have a CIC model
that they all feel confident in. This
could take a few months.

First meeting of the CIC Learning Forum.
The Independent Chair calls and hosts this session. Current CIC board members and newly appointed residents/community stakeholders will attend. This first session should explore the history of the CIC to date and will also road map the training, activities and visits that will be undertaken during the reconstitution based on what the Learning Forum is looking to achieve.

After reflection and amendment based on the engagement that is received, the final CIC model is refined and publicised. At this point the Learning Forum would also begin the process to appoint the new CIC board members based on the new structure.

The new CIC board is appointed with the structure that has been agreed via the Learning Forum. The role of the Learning Forum is complete and finishes.
